O Centro Universitário Fundação Santo André torna público o oferecimento por meio da Pró-reitora de Pós-Graduação, Pesquisa e Extensão – PROPPEX – de um curso de idiomas na Língua Inglesa gratuito, destinado a seus alunos, docentes e funcionários.

1) Sobre o número de vagas ofertadas e sobre o público-alvo

Serão ofertadas duas turmas com até 30 alunos cada, com a seguinte distribuição: 24 vagas para alunos; 03 vagas para funcionários e 03 vagas para docentes.

2) Sobre as vagas e os pré-requisitos dos candidatos

Para concorrer às vagas, o candidato, no caso de aluno, deve estar regularmente matriculado, ou não estar em afastamento, no caso de docente ou funcionário. Além disso, deve se submeter às etapas de:

I – Inscrição;

II – Sorteio;

Havendo vagas em aberto na categoria docente ou funcionário, essas serão transferidas para a categoria alunos.

Cada participante poderá se inscrever nos dois horários ofertados, mas, caso seja sorteado em um deles, terá sua inscrição automaticamente indeferida para a outra turma.

Não haverá lista de espera.

3) Sobre o material didático e as necessidades do curso

O curso será ofertado na modalidade de Ensino Remoto. Para tanto, o aluno deve possuir equipamento conectado à Internet que possibilite interagir com o professor, usando sua imagem e sua voz.

O material utilizado no curso não será disponibilizado permanentemente, cabendo ao participante realizar o download do material indicado.

É responsabilidade única do candidato acompanhar o resultado do sorteio.

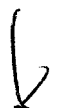

É necessário que o participante tenha no mínimo 80% de frequência para sua aprovação, o que corresponde a um máximo de 03 horas/aula de faltas, bem como obtenha nota mínima de 7,0 (sete) na avaliação do curso, devendo ainda responder ao questionário de avaliação do curso.

A tolerância de atraso nas aulas é de 10 (dez) minutos; após, será dada 1 (uma) falta (correspondente a 1 hora/aula).
